Steps to Show Empathy:

- Listen without judgment.
- Validate the other person's feelings.
- Provide supportive feedback.

Effective teamwork depends on clear communication and the ability to address conflicts constructively.



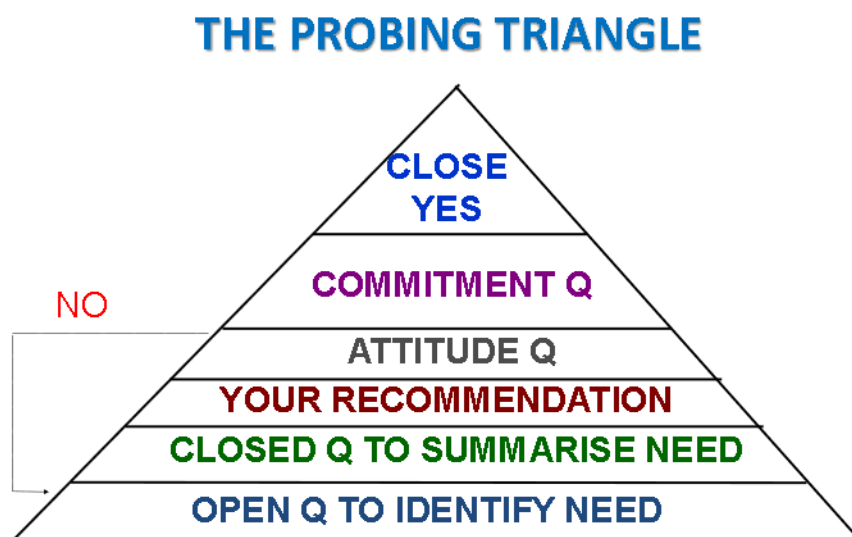
CAST Formula for Interpersonal Communication:

- Clarity
- Active Listening
- Solution-Oriented
- Transparency

The Probing Triangle

Key Concept:

This technique helps to ask the right questions to understand others better and foster communication.



Steps of the Probing Triangle:

- Open Questions to Identify Needs
- Closed Questions to Summarize
- Attitude Questions to Gauge Commitment

Clarity in communication helps to avoid misunderstandings and ensures that messages are understood as intended.

How to Achieve Clarity:

- Organize thoughts before speaking.
- Use simple, concise language.
- Confirm understanding through feedback.

Being transparent about intentions and thoughts builds trust and strengthens communication

Steps to Transparency:

- Be open and honest about your thoughts.
- Admit mistakes and gaps in knowledge.
- Avoid hiding information to manipulate the situation.



Using personal anecdotes or examples makes communication more relatable and authentic.

How to Build a Personal Connection:

- Share relevant stories or experiences.
- Show empathy and understanding toward the other person's perspective.

- Maintain eye contact and use positive body language.

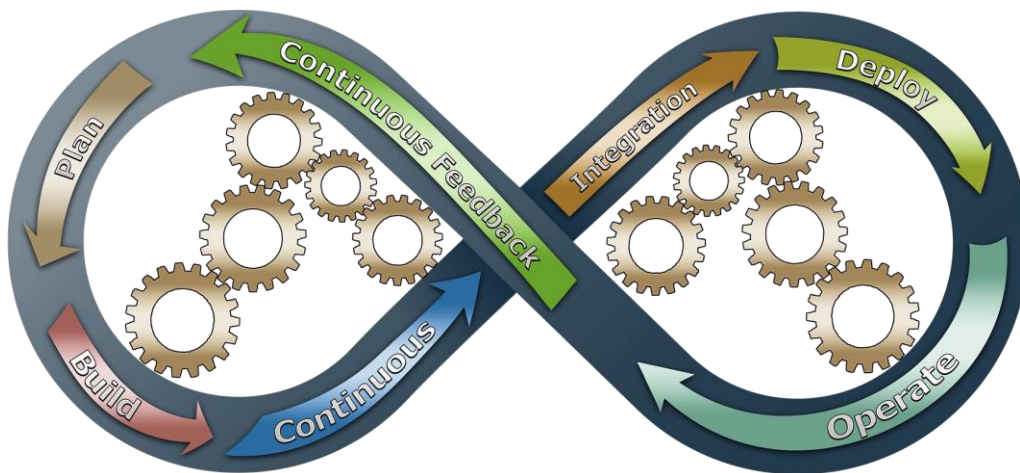
